Why not make learning something new part of your New Year's resolutions for 2018? Join the hundreds of locals and snowbirds eager to take low-cost, daytime classes through the Center for Lifelong Learning (known as CLL). They can choose from more than 70 amazing subjects like: yoga, exercise, dancing, computers, video processing, art, crafts, history, bird watching, basket weaving, current events, foreign affairs, estate planning, investing, aquatic swimming, wine tasting, sewing, quilting and many more. Open to adults of all ages, these classes are designed for personal enjoyment-- with no tests, no grades, no stress.

All students can sign up for CLL classes in person on January 5 between 9 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. They register at the auditorium (Building 8) of the joint campus of the University of Northwest Florida and Northwest Florida State College, 1170 Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, in Fort Walton Beach. Late registrants can come to the lobby of the UWF Building 1 (administration) between 9 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. on January 8, 9 and 10. After that, they can register between 9 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. in Building 4, Room 461 (CLL Office).

The Center for Lifelong Learning, Inc. is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization which has offered low-cost, enriching classes and social events twice a year for 25 years. Some of our social events include the "Friday Special Events" open to the general public at no charge from 12:00 noon until 1:00 in the UWF/NWFSC auditorium.
